JUNIOR PRIMARY PERFORMING ARTS, CHOIRS AND PERCUSSION BAND NEWS

Performing Arts Night: Congratulations to the four highly talented students who represented the Junior Primary at Tuesday night's concert. **Audrey Wiederman, Nalani Duffy** and **Nathan Trotter** amazed the audience with their piano solos while **Ruby Flynn** delighted them with her tap dance routine. The **Middle Primary Choir** made the audience tap their feet, laugh and then fall silent with their three songs in completely different styles. **Lily Tonev** produced a hauntingly beautiful vocal solo. The **Festival Choir**, fresh from an A grading in their assessment by the Festival of Music deputy conductor, sang their hearts out. The **Fulham North Percussion Band's** best performance yet of their own composition was the perfect preparation for their audition next Monday for the Festival of Music. We all wish them well. Personally I would like to thank our Middle and Upper Primary Performing Arts teacher **Nicole Hooke** for her efforts to make this such an entertaining night.

Junior Primary Performing Arts:

Lessons this term focus indigenous dance, music and story telling. We are working with the Kurna story of Kondili the whale. Ask your child to retell it to you. We are also listening to the song Marrayuna by Yolngu rap artist Baker Boy. My aim is to show that aboriginal culture is both ancient and emerging. I have edited the video clip of the song that I show the children to make it age appropriate. The words of the song are reprinted in this newsletter so you can understand the warmth of the message it gives. The children are continuing their investigations into Drama and Music and are gaining confidence at designing their own learning experiences and stretching their learning.

Introducing Michael Hand:

There are times when I am unable to teach, such as rehearsals for school performances, choir conferences, Festival of Music responsibilities and leave. On these days it is important to me that your child's education in the Performing Arts continues. To this end I try to consistently book **Michael Hand**, an Orff Schulwerk trained teacher who brings his own class set of glockenspiels to school to teach chants, playing techniques, composition and reading notation. He supports our school's high expectations of behaviour. He is also a wonderful pianist. Ask your child to sing you a chant Mr Hand has taught them.



Reports:

Reports on your child's progress will be sent home at the end of this term. I will be reporting to the following Australian Curriculum achievement standards in Music and Dance this term and in Drama at the end of term 4 when I have more data on your child's abilities. Foundation and year 1 students work towards the same achievement standard as year 2s.

MUSIC: *By the end of Year 2, students communicate about the music they listen to, make and perform and where and why people make music. Students improvise, compose, arrange and perform music. They demonstrate aural skills by staying in tune and keeping in time when they sing and play.*

DANCE: By the end of Year 2, students describe the effect of the elements in dance they make, perform and view and where and why people dance. Students use the elements of dance to make and perform dance sequences that demonstrate fundamental movement skills to represent ideas. Students demonstrate safe practice.

I am enjoying teaching all the Junior Primary children immensely. It is an honour to watch their growing confidence and ability. And as for the Middle and Upper Primary Ensembles? They are one of the best parts of my week.

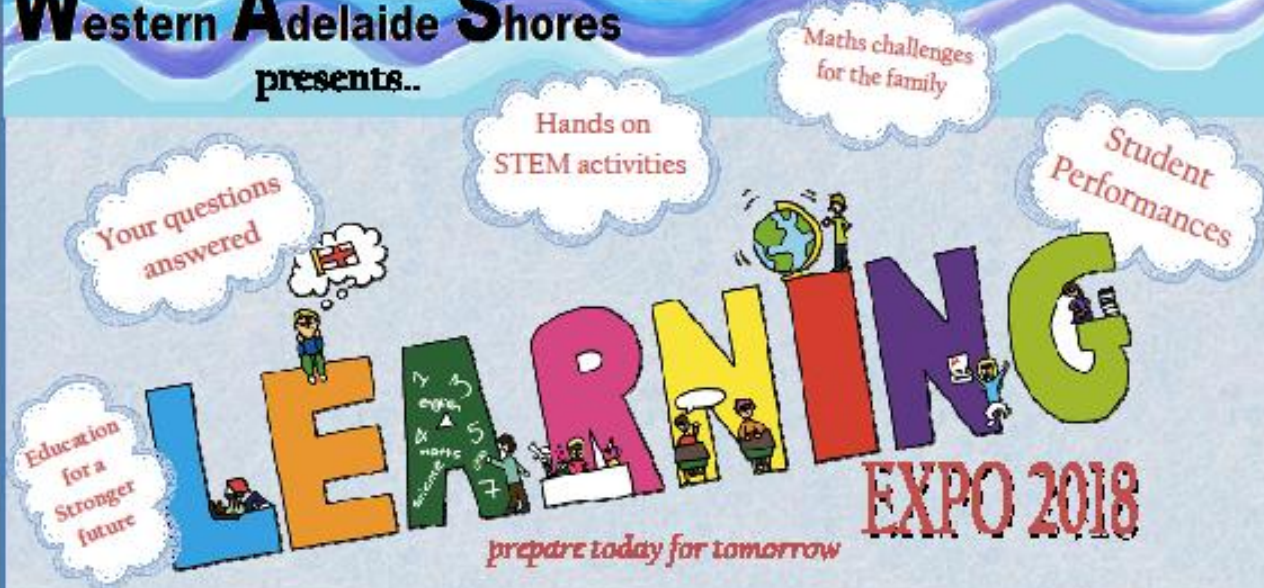
