Dear Parents and Carers,  
Welcome back for what will be, as always, a very busy Term 4. I hope that you all had an enjoyable break. This term sees Swimming, Aquatics, Bike Ed, Year 7 Graduation, Spring Fair, Sports Day, Class Placements and many other activities all taking place over the next 9 weeks.

### **Staffing Update**

This term we welcome back John Corbett to our staff who will be continuing in the PE role while Kristian Rawlings is in the Deputy Principal role. We also welcome Rachel Tatera who will be taking on the position of Pastoral Care Worker. Rachel will be with us on a Monday and Tuesday. Her position is funded by the local churches and she has provided more information on her role later in this newsletter. As you would also be aware from the note that was sent home yesterday, I will be leaving at the end of the term to take up the Principal position at Surrey Downs Primary School. We will start the process of finding a replacement for the Deputy Principal position as soon as we are able.

### **Class Placements**

We will soon be working on class structure and class placements for 2017.

Every year we aim to arrange the following year's class groupings to meet the learning needs of students and the skills and teaching styles of our teachers.

When planning classes, consideration is given to estimated enrolments, Reception intakes, class numbers and gender balance.

The teachers put a great deal of time into class placements and their professional judgement and knowledge of the individual student plays a vital role in the process. When allocating students to classes, teachers take into account friendship groups, special needs, learning styles and balance of class groupings. Every effort is made to place students with at least one friend.

If you have any specific requests regarding your child's placement for 2016 please let me know by Wednesday of Week 2, **Wednesday October 26**. A Request will only be considered if it is in writing or email to **russell.barwell303@schools.sa.edu.au** by the due date.

Requests can be made based on specific learning, social or emotional needs. I must stress that requests for specific teachers and specific teacher gender cannot and will not be entertained. Please include your child's current class teacher and their 2016 year level with the information you provide.

If you know that your child will not be attending Fulham North Primary next year, can you please also notify us as soon as possible.

You can be assured that we do spend a great deal of time and effort in placing children into appropriate class groups. Please note that it is the Principal's responsibility to make final decisions on classes and student placement.

### **Bike Ed**

During this term students across the school will be participating in Bike Education lessons. Please make sure that if your child is participating in the program that they have a helmet and their bike on the required days. As a school we are unable to store bikes here on site overnight,

so please make sure that they are taken home at the end of each day.

### **Hats**

As we are now in Term 4, I would like to remind everyone that students are required to wear a hat in the yard in line with our sun smart policy. Hats are available to order/purchase from the uniform shop.

### **Spring Fair**

### **STEM Works**

Progress on our STEM Works upgrade is gathering pace, following the appointment of Edge Architects as the project's architect. STEM is the name given to science, technology, engineering and mathematics (incorporating physics and chemistry). These are often taught together, recognising their interrelationship.

Over the next six weeks, the architects will work closely with school and department staff to develop project plans. This begins the process of turning our school's vision into reality, with plans and designs in place at the study's conclusion. Our \$1 million project is one of 139 across the state.
