We had two retiring Council members: Jo Carcatis and Greg Campbell. I would like to take this opportunity to thank both Jo and Greg for their hard work and

commitment to our school during their time on Governing Council.

The first meeting of the new council will take place at 7:00pm on Monday, 22 February. I certainly look forward to working with them all in 2016.

EXTERNAL REVIEW FINDINGS

In July 2015 we were part of the Department for Education and Child Development's External Review process. A large number of parents were directly involved and results of the review have now been made public. I would be interested in your viewpoint regarding the directions. Please feel free to email me your comments on the directions and indeed ideas that you may have for implementation.

OUTCOMES OF EXTERNAL SCHOOL REVIEW 2015

Fulham North Primary School is tracking well in that teachers are engaging with the Australian Curriculum implementation and students show respect for each other

and demonstrate a sense of belonging to a caring, safe school community.

The Principal will work with the Education Director to implement the following Directions:

1. Support quality learning outcomes for all students by engaging in ongoing monitoring and critical evaluation of the equity and effect of differentiated learning approaches utilised to meet the diverse needs of learners.
2. Build teachers' capacity to provide quality formative and summative feedback that helps students to achieve assessment criteria, benchmark their progress, and improve continuously against standards.
3. Improve student achievement by enabling parents to be involved as partners in their child's learning through a coordinated and consistent communication strategy and approach.
4. Promote high expectations for student learning to increase the number of students achieving at the higher levels of proficiency by critically evaluating current practices, and how these support the implementation of improvement priorities; in particular, promoting opportunities for students to be challenged and engaged in rich, purposeful tasks in meaningful contexts.

Based on the school's current performance, Fulham North Primary School will be externally reviewed again in 2019.

GONSKI FUNDING

Many of you may have heard of the Gonski Report and associated school funding proposal. The work was commissioned by the previous Federal Government and the new federal Government committed to funding the first 4 years of a 6 year proposal. We have received some funding through this model and have utilised our extra money to support students with learning issues by purchasing SSO time for the SSO to work with these students. Suzi Vladimirov, The local organiser for the Australian Education Union spoke to the AGM about the importance of the Gonski Funding and the positive impact the extra money can and is having in schools. Whilst the current federal Government has not made commitment to the final 2 years it is pleasing to note that the State Government has committed to the full 6 years of funding. The final 2 years of funding is where the majority of 'Gonski Funding' dollars are promised and I am certainly keen to see this funding in schools to be used to make a difference to educational outcomes for our Learning community.

PICK UP AND DROP OFF CARE

A significant number of families drive their children to school and pick them up in the afternoon. The drop off situation is spread out over a 20 minute period and generally does not pose a problem. Having said that, it is appreciated when motorists obey all traffic laws and parking signs. The pick-up in the afternoon can cause some congestion as it occurs over a much shorter time period. I was recently contacted by a nearby family whose car was damaged by one of our parents during an after school pick up in Borthwick Street. The offending car reversed into the

resident's car which was parked in the street and then immediately left the scene. This is very disappointing to know that this has occurred and indeed a very expensive exercise for the victim. Please be very careful when picking up and dropping off your children. Reversing for any reason during this very busy time is not recommended, as there are always numerous children in the vicinity.

SAFETY IS EVERYONE'S BUSINESS

COMPOSITE CLASSES

From time to time I speak with parents whose children are in composite classes (two or more year levels) and there is sometimes a perception that this could be detrimental to the child's education. This is particularly of a concern to parents whose child is in the higher grade of the composite thinking that their child's learning will be held back as the teacher will be targeting work at the lower level students. Conversely, if the child is in the lower grade level some parents feel that their child will be able to progress more readily by working with higher level students. Our aim is that all students progress as much as they can no matter what their designated year level. Composite classes have been a part of schooling for well over 30 years now and they are an integral part of a teachers work. The teachers are able to manage the curriculum in these situations and it is the individualised expectations of the teacher that make the biggest difference.

The teachers are all highly trained quality practitioners and work with students to make sure the best outcomes are achieved. It should not and does not matter what year level label the child is given, the teachers will ensure the work and expectations are commensurate with challenging the students, with a view to stretching each child and ensuring high quality learning. This happens in all classes irrespective of whether they are single year level or composite. Differentiation of the curriculum is key part of our daily work and a focus for the Western Adelaide Shores Partnership. Some of our students have Individual Learning Plans and some have Negotiated Curriculum Plans to meet specific needs. Teachers are professional and trained to cope with a diverse range of abilities and learning styles.

Linley Lloyd, a senior lecturer in education at the University of New England, has studied composite classes and says the most important factor in their success or failure was "the quality of the teacher".

As well as an experienced and talented teacher, better results are believed to occur if students in the composite class are "independent workers" who respond to the stimulating environment.

"Teachers of multi-age classes may be more likely to see their students as diverse than as similar and to provide developmentally appropriate, that is, differentiated, curricula," she wrote in a research paper. "Tests of academic achievement consistently show either the same or slightly improved scores from children in multi-age classes.

"In addition, there seems to be a benign positive (though small) effect in terms of social/emotional development -

children seem to like school better and be more advanced in 'interpersonal intelligence' than their peers in age-segregated or 'straight' classes."

Social benefits include a wider choice of friends, earlier opportunities for leadership roles, mentoring of younger students by older ones and "less competition and aggression". A downside can be the loss of the sense of ownership and identity that comes with being in an age-specific group.

If you have specific concerns about your child's learning please talk with their class teacher.

SCHOOL FEES

Invoices for the Materials and Services charge for 2016 have been sent home and I must thank the many families who have already paid. We rely heavily on our parent contributions and would appreciate prompt payment. The fee for 2016 has been set at \$320, this equates to just over \$1 per day and in my opinion, represents excellent value given the high quality education delivered here at Fulham North Primary School. This amount compares very favourably with nearby Government schools and naturally is significantly cheaper than the Private School System. If you are having difficulties in meeting this obligation please give myself or Wendy a call and we can arrange a payment plan or point you in the direction of a School Card application if applicable. We always run an incentive program for school fee payments by way of a raffle and where fees are paid in full or time payment arrangements made, students will be entered into this raffle with the prize drawn at the end of first term.

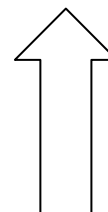
