Dear Parents and Carers,

We are now at the half way point of Term 3 and I am continually amazed and proud of all of the fantastic events and work that is produced from both our students and staff. The conversations that I have with students about their learning are always very pleasing and a reminder of why I enjoy coming to Fulham North every day.

As you would have read in the note that was sent home yesterday, we had an incident yesterday where some of our students were approached by some unknown individuals and encouraged to get into their car with them. Our students did an amazing job and reported the incident immediately to the teacher on yard duty. This is an important reminder for all of us to talk to our students and children about the strategies that they need to use to keep themselves safe. The work that classroom teachers do through teaching the Child Protection Curriculum enabled these students to calmly deal with a threatening situation, in a manner that they were kept safe and the incident could

be dealt with quickly and appropriately. I would implore you all to talk with your children and reinforce the importance of staying safe and what they should do if faced with a similar situation.

Book Week

It was wonderful to see so many students and teachers dress up and get into the spirit of Book Week today. I especially liked seeing so many costumes that were homemade; thank you all for your efforts! I would especially like to thank **Melissa Harris, Ellen Yeoman, Heather McDonald and Kristin Martin** for their amazing efforts in organising our Book Week assembly and Book Fair. If you have not yet visited our Book Fair in the Library, you still have a chance as it finishes tomorrow (Friday).

NAPLAN

Over the last two weeks we have been involved in the NAPLAN Online Trial. The Trial was aimed to test the capabilities of our online network to see if it was able to

cope with the load of completing NAPLAN in the future. I am pleased to say that teachers and students did a wonderful job throughout the trial and our systems all worked well. The data collected from the Trial is purely system data and not student achievement data. Our 2016 NAPLAN results were sent home last week to all students in Years 3, 5 & 7. Staff will be looking at the NAPLAN results in the near future. If you would like to discuss your child's NAPLAN results please speak with their class teacher.

Nude Food Day is happening next Wednesday 31 August. Nude Food Day is a fantastic opportunity for children to learn about how their actions can impact the environment and their health.

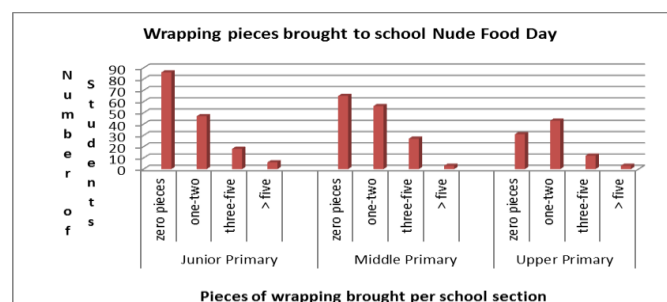
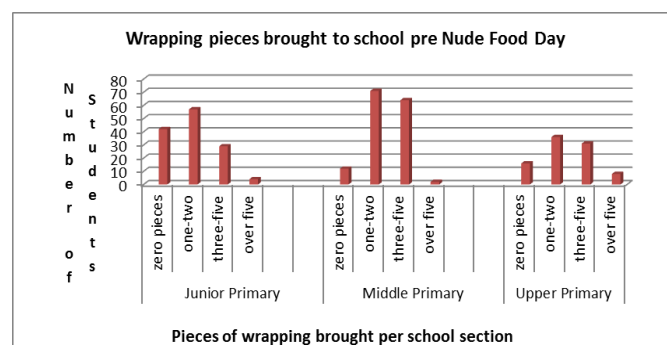
'Nude food = a healthy body + a healthy planet'. We want students to choose healthy, rubbish free food for their lunches and snacks.

TERM 2 NUDE FOOD DAY AT FULHAM NORTH-WEDNESDAY 22 JUNE

The aim of Nude Food Day is to reduce the amount of wrappings brought to school by students and as a result, have less sent to landfill. From the graphs above, it can be seen that a significantly lower amount of wrappings was brought to school on NFD than on the pre NFD survey a week before. Our aim is to have this lower amount happening consistently, even when it is not a NFD.

Over the period of a year, a reduction of even only 1 piece of wrapping per student per day would result in approximately 80,000 less pieces of wrapping just from FNPS alone, going to landfill. Please support your child, school and the environment in helping us to achieve that reduction.

Ways you can reduce the amount of wrapping are – having lunch boxes with separate sections, re-useable containers for food and drink, eat fruit and veg that are in season rather than packaged, buy larger versions of packaged snacks and portion them into re-useable containers.
