#### Dear Parents and Carers,

This week it has been great to see our students and staff enjoying the wonderful Spring weather. I have been really pleased to see classes making the most of the warmer weather and enjoying their learning both in the classroom and the yard.

#### Butterfly Garden

During the past few weeks we have had a number of instances where plants in our butterfly garden have been trampled on. In order to minimize the damage to the plants and begin the process of regenerating the garden, we will be closing the butterfly garden. I am hopeful that the work that we do in regenerating the garden will be completed in a

timely manner and will enhance what is a very popular area within our yard.

### **PAT Testing**

Over the coming weeks students from Years 2-7 across the state will be taking the PAT Maths and Reading Tests. These tests are completed online and the information gained from them is a very useful tool for teachers and the school to track a student's individual progress from year to year. If you have any questions regarding the tests please speak with child's class teacher.

### **R U OK?**
