Dear Parents and Carers,

Our Professional Learning day held on Tuesday was a very big success with all staff taking part in valuable learning experiences. In the morning our teachers worked with other teachers from sites in our Western Adelaide Shores Partnership and planned units of work. In the afternoon the teachers participated in valuable workshops related to the Australian Curriculum and Planning. I fully understand that the school being closed on occasions can be an inconvenience to families, your support of our Learning Community is greatly appreciated

ROAD SAFETY

Road safety is everyone's business and this is particularly relevant around our school. It has been brought to my attention that a number of children are not using the designated crossings on North Street and Cheadle Street to cross the road. This is made worse by the fact that parents appear to be condoning this practice. Parents park their cars and call student over the road, this is a dangerous practice and I ask that all student and parents use the designated crossings. If it means walking a few metres more it is well worth it. I would much rather see someone take a minute or two extra than witness a tragedy.

It is important that all students and adults use the designated crossings as a safe route across the street.

Parents are also dropping children off in no standing zones, adjacent to the crossings, parking in bus zones and double parking which is particularly dangerous. The local Council have been present of late and informed me that that will be making more visits to the area. I am led to believe that they have issued a number of warnings but will be fining in future. I am sure that no-one wants a substantial fine when dropping off or picking up their children.

RAP, RHYME AN RYTHM

A good number of our very talented students have been practicing for our RAP RHYME and RHYTM evening which will be held on Wednesday, 29 June in the Gym. It is a great night and I encourage families to attend. Many thanks to Kristin Martin who has been working with the students on their presentations.

AFTER SCHOOL PLAY

I have mentioned in previous newsletters that I am a supporter of children playing in the yard after school. This is a healthy lifestyle practice and should be encouraged.

However, normal school rules still apply and children must be under the supervision of parents. We have had a few incidents of late where parents have not been supervising adequately and issues have occurred. Please make sure that you are supervising your children after school and ensure that school rules which are predominately based on safety are adhered to. Students who do not follow the rules and endanger or hurt others will be asked to leave.
