Dear Parents and Carers,

TERM 3

Term three commences on Monday, 25 July and will include Science week, Book week, District Athletics Day and numerous other interesting activities. The Royal Adelaide Show is also in Term 3 and that means a school closure day, this year our Show Day is Monday, 5 September.

PRAISE AND GROWTH MINDSET V FIXED MINDSET

Praising our children is an age old part of parenting and teaching. We tend to praise our own children a great deal as they progress through millstones of growing up. This is particularly evident from Birth to age 5 as so much learning happens in that short space of time. It is interesting to note that praise that highlights effort is much better than praise that tells a child how good they are. Children who are praised by being told how smart they are feel good at first

but when they make mistakes, (and let's face it, we all do make mistakes) they think they are not so smart. This can in fact affect the child's mindset as to whether they believe they have a growth mindset or a fixed mindset. Praise that acknowledges effort allows for mistakes and children continue to learn and feel better about themselves. Researchers found that praise given to children between birth and age 3 predicted their mindset many years later. The impact of praise that children receive can be so strong that it affects their behaviour immediately.

RAP RHYME AND RHYTHM

Last night we were treated to a fantastic display of more Fulham North Primary School talent. The Rap Rhyme and Rhythm show was a great night with lots of students showing their skills and confidence on the stage. It was amazing to see so many original poems being recited. Well done to all involved. Special thanks to Kristin Martin, Catherine Almond and Heather McDonald for their organisation and commitment. It was great to see so many members of our learning community in attendance.

SCHOOL CHAPLAINCY

After careful consideration and listening to feedback we have decided that we will go ahead with sourcing a School Chaplain/ Pastoral Care Worker and will continue discussions with the School Ministries group on how this might progress. **It is important to note that working with the Chaplain will be on a consent basis and parents will need to give permission for their child to be involved in**

any aspects of the program. I really appreciated the feedback that I received with regard to this matter and it is a sign of a strong Learning Community that parents are open to giving their opinion.

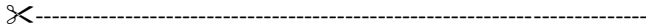
