### **Facility upgrades**

Over the coming school holidays, we will be having some facility upgrades being undertaken through the support of the Governing Council. ### **Council Update**

Cudmore Terrace has been identified as one of the most dangerous roads in Charles Sturt Council area. This year, Council has allocated \$200,000 in its Budget (2016-17) to construct traffic safety measures in Cudmore Terrace from Henley Beach Road to Grange Road. The following will be installed:

Pedestrian crossing facilities will be installed near Henley and Grange Memorial oval and Western Community Hospital to enable safe crossing.

A dedicated bicycle lane.

Dual turning lanes at Henley Beach and Grange road intersections to improve entry/exit of motor vehicles.

Work will commence later this year.

### **Car Parking**

Since our last edition of North Talk, I have had a number of calls and emails from parents and other community members raising concerns around car parking. There have been a number of complaints about parents parking in No Standing zones and bus stops around the school. As a result of these issues, the Charles Sturt Council has been contacted and they have assured me that they will have inspectors out monitoring parking around the school.

Finally, as I come to the end of my first Term as the Acting Principal, I would like to thank the entire Fulham North Community for your support over this Term and wish you

all a safe holiday and I look forward to seeing everyone back at school on October 17 to start Term 4.

### **SWIMMING WEEK**

In Week 3 of Term 4 our foundation to Year 5 students will be attending swimming lessons. This proves to be an exhausting time for all, but there are many ways we can help prepare our students to ensure all runs smoothly.

Make sure your child can dress independently. Often students are still damp when they are getting dressed and clothing can be difficult to put on. We have to get dressed quickly to hop on the bus so it is important that young students have had lots of practise at getting ready quickly, are shown how to dry off their hair, and can put on shoes quickly.

We encourage parents to send their child/ren to school in their bathers under their school uniform – 2 pieces are more manageable for girls especially if they need to go to the toilet throughout the day. As swimming is inside, boys do not need to wear rash tops.

Shoes and socks can also take precious time and socks are often misplaced, therefore we recommend young students wear sandals and do not worry about socks during this week.

On returning to school students have the opportunity to have a snack to replenish. No food is to be given to students at the swimming centre to snack on unless they have a medical condition and it has been prearranged with the class teacher.
