Dear Parents and Carers,

It was great to see so many parents assisting with our Giant Soup Day last week. A massive thanks goes out to those who assisted. We are very lucky here at Fulham North to have so many parents and carers who are happy to volunteer their time. This is a tradition of our Learning Community and is always very well received. Naturally it also teaches the students about where food comes from and great pride is taken by classes when harvesting their crops which they have nurtured and witnessed grow, literally from seedling to the plate. Huge thanks to our **Enviro Kids** for their help and to **Dean Cutts, Gill Ryan** and **Peter Hutton** for their work and dedication to the process.

#### SOCIAL MEDIA

Social media is ever present on many forms these days and can be a very useful tool for communication. I personally use Facebook to communicate within my group of friends and family and I find it very useful at times. There are many other forms such as Twitter, Snapchat, What’s App, Instagram, Pinterest and the list goes on. Any form of social media can be seen to be useful and if used properly

will be an asset to communication. Unfortunately users can be exposed to inappropriate material through these media platforms. I know that many of our students have accounts with some or indeed many of these. One thing about social media is the fact that things can be and are said that a person would not say to someone in person. This can and has caused issues at this school and many other schools I have worked at. There are occasions when these issues then come up at school, cause further conflict or hurt and we are then left to pick up the pieces and deal with the potential conflicts.

Many parents are fully aware of the social media their children use and in fact monitor the use and tackle issues as they arise, others are unaware and then surprised when issues come up. It is highly recommended that parents closely monitor social media use by their children. I know that some parents who have issues at home with obsessive use and this can cause disharmony. Simple and effective solutions to this are restricted use times, putting devices in a box for a while each evening, and turning the modem off at night. If a problem does occur with a ‘Friend’ then

blocking or unfriending is a very simple and effective way forward. Responding to offensive or inappropriate messages with the same language only serves to make the problem worse. Teaching children to not respond at the first sign of inappropriate messages is the best way forward.

Please take some time to speak with your child about appropriate social media use, as I am sure it will be very a valuable exercise for both the short and long term.

### **BOOK WEEK 2017**

#### **THEME: 'ESCAPE TO EVERYWHERE'**

This year Book Week is being celebrated during weeks 4 and 5, August 18<sup>th</sup> to the 25<sup>th</sup>.

#### **Performance Friday 18th of August.**

We have an exciting start to Book Week with a performance in the gym on Friday 18th of August. 'Super Duper', is presented by 'Perform! Educational Musicals'. The performance will be based on the Book Week theme, 'Escape to Everywhere' and feature some of the short-listed children's books selected by the Children's Book Council. Please make sure the \$6 payment reaches the Finance Office by Wednesday 16<sup>th</sup> August if it has not been deducted from the already paid Excursion and Performance Charge.

#### **Book Fair**

During Book Week, a Book Fair will be held in the Library/Resource Centre starting after school Friday 18<sup>th</sup> and finishing Friday, August 25<sup>th</sup>. Students will be able to add to their personal libraries by buying quality books from our Scholastic Book Fair. The school receives a generous commission based on the number of books sold. Last year we were able to purchase over \$1500 worth of books for the school Library/Resource Centre. On the Friday before Book Week, students will visit the Library/Resource Centre to complete a 'wish list'. After that, books will be on sale before school from 8:30am and after school for the rest of the week. Please note the Monday of Book Week is a Pupil Free Day.

Upper Primary students are planning and organising lessons based on Picture Books. They have selected picture books to read to Junior Primary buddy classes during Book Week. They will prepare a learning activity for their JP buddies, based on the book they have selected.
