#### FROM THE PRINCIPAL

##### Early Dismissal Tomorrow (Friday 12 April)

As per our custom at the end of term, students will be dismissed an hour earlier than normal. Our dismissal time on Friday, 12 April will therefore be **2.00pm** and not 2.10pm as in previous years (with a previous dismissal time of 3.10pm). The assembly will begin at 1.45pm to present the Kiwanis awards. Students can wear casual clothes tomorrow with a gold coin donation supporting Kids Cancer.

##### Movie Night

One of our big fundraisers, our outdoor Movie Night, is on tonight featuring *Show Dogs*. More importantly than raising funds, these types of events help build the positive culture of our school community and is another way of connecting families. We thank all sponsors, parents, volunteers and staff in advance for making the evening possible. Particular acknowledgement to **Sally Lowe** for her leadership. ##### Injection of Computers

Last year, we spent around \$30,000 all up on Information, Communication and Technology. This year, we have a total budget of over \$85,000. We have prioritised \$70,000

expenditure and the additional \$15,000+ was made possible from the fundraising specifically from our successful Fun Run last year. We have purchased 100 new laptops which have been distributed to the library and the Year 5-7 classes with other high functioning laptops redistributed to the Year 2-4 classes. We are now in the process of purchasing 30 new I-pads for Foundation-Year 2 classes to use. Our aspiration is for our students to be able to access ICT at any stage throughout a school day to:

- Inquire and research
- Enhance creativity and innovation
- Access software which supports and extends learning
- Develop written communication including keyboard skills
- Publish work.

All tied in with our ambitious plan to unleash the wisdom in every child and young person at Fulham North Primary School.

### Landscaping

At the beginning of next term, works will commence with landscaping underneath and around the new shade structure. This has been a dusty area and an eyesore, so we are very excited to update this area.

### Easter Raffle

With Easter approaching rapidly we need to thank everyone for their wonderful donations for our annual Easter Raffle. It never ceases to amaze us that we are so well supported by our Learning Community. We have more than 30 baskets as prizes again this year. The majority of the raffle has been drawn this morning with the remaining ten prizes to be drawn at the Movie Night. This year we have raised just over \$1400-00 through ticket sales.
