# 2. Students (and their welfare)

#### General characteristics

The students come from a wide variety of socio-economic and cultural backgrounds.

#### Support offered

For students with disabilities, a Special Education Teacher is employed to support the implementation of their One Plan. Identified EALD students are supported by the EALD Teacher. The Deputy Principal provides support for students under care.

#### Student management

Fulham North Primary School strongly promotes students being responsible for managing their own behaviour and has a strong culture of living the school values. Therefore Student Behaviour Management (SBM) is underpinned by our values and students are encouraged to conduct themselves in accordance with these values in both class and yard. The school values are: Getting Along, Communication, Confidence, Organisation, Persistence and Life Long Learning.

#### Student voice

A Student Executive representing Year 3-7 classes meet fortnightly to discuss issues and to take local action on matterx of student interest. The school has four school captains who represent the school at delegations and events and oversee the school assemblies.

- Opportunities for extensive involvement in school sports programs

# 3. Key School Policies

Site Improvement Plan has the following challenges of practice:

- If all teachers collaborate to design learning that engages students in contextualised mathematical problem-solving, we will increase the growth and achievement of students
- If we implement a common approach to engage students in purposeful writing tasks with specific feedback, we will increase the amount of students achieving higher bands in NAPLAN writing
- If we embed agreed common practices in reading programs from Foundation to Year 7 with support and accountability, we will improve the continuity of reading progress for every learner

This means that our students:

- Inquire and problem solve to connect mathematics with real life contexts
- Write for a purpose to engage an intended audience
- Embrace reading as a personal experience to gain knowledge and for enjoyment.

### 4. Curriculum

Subject offerings

The curriculum at Fulham North Primary School is guided by the Australian Curriculum. Specialist areas are Indonesian, Performance Arts and Physical Education.

Special curriculum features

We are committed to incorporating STEM learning approaches and have a new STEM facility to support this learning. Students access I-pads from Foundation to Year 2 and laptops from Year 3 to Year 7.

Individual classes organise excursions and incursions throughout the school year. They provide valuable learning and social experiences for our students.

Reporting to parents is on-going and is both formal and informal. During Term 1 parents are invited to our 'Season Launch Community Evening' to meet teachers and explore students' learning environments. Later in Term 1, interviews occur whereby students lead conferences by sharing their learning and their goals. In Term 2 and Term 4 a detailed written report is provided. As an option, student led conferences occur again in Term 3.

School and class newsletters provide regular communication with families with a number of class teachers using electronic forms of communication.

Students organise and lead assemblies every fortnight showcasing powerful learning across the school and celebrating students' successes.

Fulham North Primary School is part of the Western Adelaide Shores partnership. We enjoy a collaborative partnership with the preschools and work closely with Henley High School. Enrolling Foundation students are invited to attend two transition visits in Term 4 before starting. Year 7 students beginning secondary school take part in transition visits in their respective schools.

## 5. Sporting Activities

Fulham North is a sport-focussed school and with the fantastic support from our parent body we are able to run several Saturday morning school sporting teams throughout the year. Sports include football, soccer and cricket.

After school hours sport is open to all students in a range of sports including football, cricket, T-Ball, netball, volleyball, basketball and soccer.

Knockout tournaments – State-wide Year 6/7-competition; selection will be based on merit at the coaches' discretion. Sports include cricket, football, netball, softball, hockey and soccer.

District Representative Sports Teams - students are nominated by their coaches and school based sport staff to attend trials for their chosen sport.

Airport SAPSASA District Carnivals - the school competes in district carnivals in Swimming, Athletics and Cross Country. All students are invited to attend trials and selection is merit based.

State Representative teams - through participation in SAPSASA students may be offered to trial by the state and district coaches. State teams play in National competitions once a year in most sports.

## 6. Other Co-Curricular Activities

- End of year whole school performance
- Casual dress days are held each term with money raised supporting charity
- Rap, Rhyme and Rythym and musical evening
- Regular sporting clinics to support the PE program
- An Athletics day and Sports Day are held annually
- Bike Education sessions teach bike riding and safety skills
- A range of incursions are held each year to introduce students to a variety of performances and speakers
- Book Week and Book Fair
- PE Week celebrations

### 7. Staff

Staff profile

20 class teachers across 17 classes. Specialist teachers in Performance Arts, Physical Education, Indonesian, library, EALD and Special Education. Total teacher time – 24.7 FTE. 10 SSOs are employed working around 280 hours per week in total. A groundsperson works 22.5 hours per week.

Leadership structure

The leadership structure consists of Principal, Deputy Principal and two Learning Coordinators, F-2 and 3-7.

Performance Management

All staff are involved in performance management sessions with their line manager. Support is provided through professional learning and mentoring.

Specialist agencies and staff who support the school community include: Guidance, Speech Pathology, Interagency Behaviour Management, Hearing Impairment, Vision Impairment

Other

An ICT technician provides maintenance, repair and overview of all ICT devices and network efficiency.

## 8. School Facilities

Buildings and grounds

The main building consists of administration and leadership, staff room, Junior Primary classrooms, STEM facility, resource centre, Indonesian Room, Upper Primary Learning space, hall, canteen and OSHC.

The General Learning Area has 3 Year 3/4 classes, with another Year 3/4 class located next to 2 year 5 classes facing the oval. The 2 Year 2 classes are in the South East Corner.

We are fortunate in having spacious grounds, including a soccer pitch, football oval, four playground areas, a covered pergola area, a large asphalt area and many native trees providing shade.

Specialist facilities

A multi purpose hall provides space for Performance Arts.

Staff facilities

A staff car park is provided.

Access for students and staff with disabilities

Wheel chair access is available to most areas. No access is currently available to upstairs which includes the library, Year 6/7 classrooms and Indonesian Room. A disability toilet and shower is in the main building.

Access to bus transport

Public transport available.

# 10. School Operations

Decision making structures

The leadership team meets weekly to consider staff leave requests, excursion/camp requests and to discuss overall operations of the school.

Staff meetings are held every Tuesday afternoon, 3.30 – 5.00pm.

Governing Council meetings are held twice a term. Sub committee meetings for Fundraising, Canteen, Facilities and Finance are held regularly and report back to Governing Council.

Class meetings are held to discuss class and school issues.

The Student Executive meets fortnightly.

Regular publications

The school newsletter, North Talk is published fortnightly.

Notices are sent via the Skool Bag app.

A 'Day Book' in the staffroom provides daily information.

The Deputy Principal provides a daily email notice to all staff.

Classes send home class newsletters regularly.

Many class teachers are communicating with parents electronically by means such as See Saw.

An enrolment package and information book is provided to prospective parents.

School information and policies are on the school website.

# 11. Local Community

#### General characteristics

Fulham North Primary School is situated in the popular beachside suburb of Henley Beach, a 20 minute drive west of the Adelaide CBD. Families are generally long term residents in the area. The school is highly regarded in the area and across the State.

We have a very supportive parent community. Parents are involved in many classroom activities, support, transporting, sports coaching, camps & excursions, fundraising and canteen.
