STUDENT UNIFORM POLICY

Rationale

Students are required to wear the Fulham North Primary School uniform. Wearing school uniform ensures that children are dressed appropriately in clothes that observe health, safety and decency standards and are practical for a wide range of physical activities and weather conditions.

Wearing a school uniform gives our students a sense of belonging to our school community and removes competition and peer pressure in terms of fashion.

On any occasion when students are leaving the school grounds (unless otherwise advised) students will be in school uniform. This is so our students can be easily identified when we are out and to show school pride.

The school uniform consists of:

Girls Uniform

- White or royal blue polo shirt short or long sleeved top. These can be bought from the uniform shop or a plain polo shirt bought elsewhere.
- Royal blue windcheater 0
- Royal blue Sports jacket 0
- Plain navy shorts/skorts (no shorter than mid-thigh) 0
- Plain navy long pants 0
- Royal blue and white check dress (no shorter than mid-thigh) 0
- Royal blue/white and grey school pinafore or skirt worn with a white or navy skivvy or round 0 neck top or polo shirt) (no shorter than mid-thigh)
- Navy tights under winter pinafore dress 0
- Bike shorts or other sports underwear can be worn under dresses for decency reasons but \cap are not to be visible.

Boys Uniform

- White or royal blue polo shirt short or long sleeved with school logo. These can be bought from the uniform shop or a plain polo shirt bought elsewhere.
- Royal blue windcheater (with school logo as above)
- Royal blue Sports jacket
- Plain navy blue shorts (no shorter than mid-thigh) \circ
- Plain navy Long pants 0

Year 6 students have a "Year 6 windcheater" and polo with a specific design for each year that is approved.

Footwear

- Lace up/Velcro fastening shoes or sneakers are required. 0
- Sandals are able to be worn in summer months provided they can be firmly done up. Toe 0 protection is preferred.

Hats

Hats are required to be worn when outside during terms 1 and 4. Hats must provide 0 protection from the sun. Appropriate hat styles include Legionnaire, bucket and broadbrimmed hats.

- Hats must be in good repair and preferably navy in colour.
- Caps are not acceptable headwear

Jewellery

Jewellery is discouraged. Any jewellery that is worn must not present a safety hazard. The school leadership team is responsible for assessing this issue.

- o Rings need to be restricted to signet or similar
- o Watches are permitted to be worn
- Chains and necklaces are not encouraged and if worn must be thin and worn inside clothing where they are protected and do not create a safety hazard
- Ear piercings must be small studs or sleepers
- Visible body piercings are discouraged

Make Up

- Make-up is not allowed unless there is a medical condition that requires make-up. If such a medical condition exists then parents/caregivers are required to contact the school.
- o Students presenting with make-up (without prior approval) will be asked to remove it.

Enforcing this policy

Managing one-off breaches

• If your child is not able to meet the school uniform policy on a given day, please provide a written explanation via the contact book or diary to avoid embarrassment to your child.

Exemptions

Students may be exempted from wearing the school uniform upon a written request from the parent/care giver to the Principal. Grounds on which exemptions will be made are:

- Religious, cultural or ethnicity
- Medical reasons
- New student (any exemptions to be discussed with principal unless prior arrangements have been agreed)
- o Itinerant students

Persistent breaches

If exemption has not been granted, the following strategies will be used for persistent breaches of the policy:

- Students will be spoken to and encouraged to wear the correct uniform
 - Parents will be contacted regarding the breach. This may be in the form of:
 - a note from the office
 - o a record of breaches
 - o an interview with the Principal (should there be no change in behaviour)

By signing the school enrolment form parents agree to abide by this School Uniform Policy.
